DJ: The first time I ever got on the drum set, I fell in love with it. When I'm in the groove, I feel great. I feel alive. I feel like everything is going to be all right. It's pretty remarkable, I think. My name is DJ. I'm from Indianapolis, and I have Hemophilia A. I was diagnosed at birth. My grandfather also had Hemophilia A and so did my older brother. When people would ask me about hemophilia, I would always say, "Oh, it's a long story." because I felt like it would make me a weirdo in their eyes. My family is very important to me. My sister Whitney and my girlfriend Christina, they've been a thousand percent supportive of me and making sure that I'm doing right by myself and my Hemophilia. Another passion of mine is comic books. Regular people who put on masks to save the world, they were dealing with the same kind of idea that I was. They lived their lives as two people. Those superheroes wanted people to know who they were. That's kind of how I thought about my Hemophilia, as I wanted to be myself. I don't want to be defined by something that I did when I had on a mask. I was approached about ELOCTATE through my doctors and HTC team about it having a prolonged half-life. When talking to my doctor about making the transition to ELOCTATE, we discussed the potential benefits and risks, and when I felt like he answered all the questions I had, I decided to make the transition. What I like about ELOCTATE is the fact that I can have those options to find a schedule that works. Since making the transition to ELOCTATE, I haven't had any bleeds, but I encourage everyone to talk to their doctors to find what works best for them. Common side effects of ELOCTATE are joint pain and general discomfort. When I stopped hiding my hemophilia with my friends and the world really, it was an uplifting feeling. It put everything in perspective for me, like there's only one you. You define yourself, because now when people ask me what hemophilia is, I don't tell them it's a long story. I tell them exactly what Hemophilia is. I'm DJ. That's the end of the story.

ELOCTATE [Antihemophilic Factor (Recombinant), Fc Fusion Protein] is a recombinant DNA derived, antihemophilic factor indicated in adults and children with Hemophilia A (congenital Factor VIII deficiency) for; on-demand treatment and control of bleeding episodes, perioperative management of bleeding, and routine prophylaxis to reduce the frequency of bleeding episodes. ELOCTATE is not indicated for the treatment of Von Willebrand disease. Important Safety Information. Do not use ELOCTATE if you have had an allergic reaction to it in the past. Tell your healthcare provider if you have or have had any medical problems, take any medicines, including prescription and non-prescription medicines, supplements, or herbal medicines, have any allergies, are breastfeeding, are pregnant or planning to become pregnant, or have been told you have inhibitors (antibodies) to Factor VIII. Allergic reactions may occur with ELOCTATE. Call your healthcare provider or get emergency treatment right away if you have any of the following symptoms: difficulty breathing, chest tightness, swelling of the face, rash, or hives. Your body can also make antibodies called, "inhibitors," against ELOCTATE, which may stop ELOCTATE from working properly. The most frequently occurring side effects of ELOCTATE are headache, rash, joint pain, muscle pain, and general discomfort. These are not all the possible side effects of ELOCTATE. Talk to your healthcare provider right away about any side
